

Up in space

Biomedical engineering major Justin Nelson was just a sophomore when his work with physics professor Ashis Mukhopadhyay on self-healing polymer composites earned him a NASA fellowship, allowing him to continue his work.

"You can't send a team up to go fix something once it's in space, so whatever you send up is everything you have," Nelson said. "The idea is to create a self-healing material so when it does run into any kind of debris or anything like that, it's able to heal itself and prevent long-term damage."



Advocating for science

Wayne State's National Science Policy Network chapter, Science Policy Network-Detroit (SciPol-Detroit), mobilizes WSU scientists and students interested in bridging the gap between science and policymaking. To that end, a group of students and faculty made a daylong advocacy trip to Lansing to meet with several state representatives and senators about bills regarding air quality, health care disparities and lead testing for children.

"My experience in Lansing was a nice one. I got the chance to speak with a few state representatives and senators on why they should support specific bills introduced in the Senate. I was also able to tour the Capitol building and learn more about how both chambers of Congress work, as well as bridging the gap between science and policy," said Azeez Ayantayo '23.

Wayne State University sees each applicant as an individual. We'll review your application based on a variety of academic factors and any supporting documentation we may need to get to know you better.



1. START ONLINE

Apply using the Wayne State application or the Common Application. The application fee is \$25.



2. SUBMIT YOUR TRANSCRIPT

Ask your high school or college to submit your transcript to WSU — this step must be completed by a school.



3. PROVIDE YOUR DETAILS

We may need additional information to finalize the application review process, including your ACT or SAT scores and supporting documentation.



A TOP TRANSFER DESTINATION

WSU is proud to be a destination for transfer students from other colleges and universities. One way we support these new Warriors is through our Transfer Student Success Center, which promotes the success of transfer students from initial interest through graduation.



FUND YOUR FUTURE

Our commitment to you is to help make college affordable, putting a degree within your reach because there's no better investment than the one you make in yourself. Research shows that college graduates earn about 75% more over a lifetime than those whose schooling ended with a high school diploma.

We have the lowest tuition among Michigan's research universities, but we know many students need additional financial support.

Wayne State provides nearly \$338 million annually in federal, state, institutional and private aid through scholarships, grants, loans and work-study programs — 59% of first-year undergraduate students had zero out-of-pocket expenses for their tuition, thanks to our tuition pledge programs like the Wayne State Guarantee and Heart of Detroit.

The first step to financial assistance is to complete the 2025-26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) using the WSU federal code, 002329, as early as possible for maximum aid consideration. Once you complete the FAFSA and if you are admitted to Wayne State, you will receive award information, which may include scholarships, grants and federal loans. Calculate your tuition cost and begin the process to file the FAFSA at go.wayne.edu.financial-aid.
