This transfer plan will help guide you in making the transition from community college to Wayne State University. **WSU strongly recommends that all transfer students meet with a WSU advisor in order to ensure you are taking the correct courses before transferring.** Here's the advisor contact information to set up an appointment:

One of the main areas of focus for transfer students is the WSU **General Education Requirements**. These are classes in addition to courses within your major that are required to ensure fundamental skills and a well-rounded education. There are two ways that transfer students can meet these requirements:

### Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA)

A student whose community college transcript is endorsed as "MTA satisfied" has completed WSU's General Education Requirements. See here for specific MTA information and courses that qualify for MTA:

### Direct Course Equivalencies for each category

- If you do not have an MTA endorsement, you can transfer the courses below to meet each requirement.
- Choose **one** from each category **except** for the Natural Scientific Inquiry, which requires **two** courses.
- Courses with an **asterisk (\*)** fall under more than one category, but these courses will fulfill only one category that would benefit the student most.

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## Advising Recommendations

- You will want to have credit in at least the following before beginning at WSU:
  - Calc 1 = MTH 191
  - CSC 1100 = CPS 171
  - BE 1600 = CPS 141
  - EET 2720 = ELE 139, 155 OR 250

## Understanding Transfer Credit

- What will transfer?** All college-level classes from regionally accredited colleges with a grade of 2.0 (C) or above will transfer. There are no specific limits to the number of transfer credits. However, each academic program has specific requirements that must be satisfied which helps determine the best number of credits to transfer.
- How will it transfer?** Courses transfer as the number of credits earned at the college where you took the class. This is true regardless of the number of credits the Wayne State equivalent course is worth. Each transferred course will match one of the following types of credits:
  - Equivalent credit** – matches a specific WSU course.
  - Department credit** – transfer into the academic department without a specific WSU course match.
  - Elective credits** – transfer as general or elective credit (GEN 1XXX or GEN 2XXX).
